I hope this message finds you well as we approach the month of May, a special time for our Catholic community as we celebrate Catholic Education Week!







STUDENT PUNCTUALITY

When students arrive after the bell (8:35 am) this disrupts the whole class.

We encourage parents to model the importance of punctuality and regular attendance for their children. There is a direct correlation between children who are often late or absent and lowered academic achievement. All teachers begin the day with either Language or Math which are very important to a student's success.

ABSENT OR LATE STUDENTS

If you know your child is going to be absent or late for school, please call the office at 519-752-1611 **BEFORE** 8:35 am with the reason for their absence. There is 24/7 voicemail available. If a call is not received your child is marked "Unconfirmed Absence". School Messenger then sends out the automatic message for you to call the school to report your child's absence. If we do not have contact from you prior to the afternoon attendance you may receive another notification from School Messenger.

DRESS CODE REMINDER

As the warmer months approach, we kindly remind you of the expectations for appropriate summer attire for our students at St. Peter's. Your support in ensuring our students dress in a manner consistent with our school values and guidelines is greatly appreciated.

Expectations for Summer Attire:

- 1. Modesty: Please ensure that clothing is modest and respectful. Tops should cover the shoulders and midriff, and shorts and skirts should be of an appropriate length.
- 2. No Offensive Graphics or Messages: Clothing with inappropriate language, images, or messages that do not align with our Catholic values are not permitted.
- 3. Footwear: Encourage your child to wear closed-toe shoes for safety and appropriate footwear for physical education classes and outdoor activities. Slides are not safe for kids for kids who are active at recess.
- 4. Sun Protection: Hats and sunscreen are encouraged for outdoor activities to protect against the sun's rays. We encourage students to apply sunscreen in morning as this is something that is to be done by students themselves.

Your cooperation in upholding these guidelines ensures a positive and respectful learning environment for all students. Together, we can foster an atmosphere where our students grow not only academically but also spiritually.
